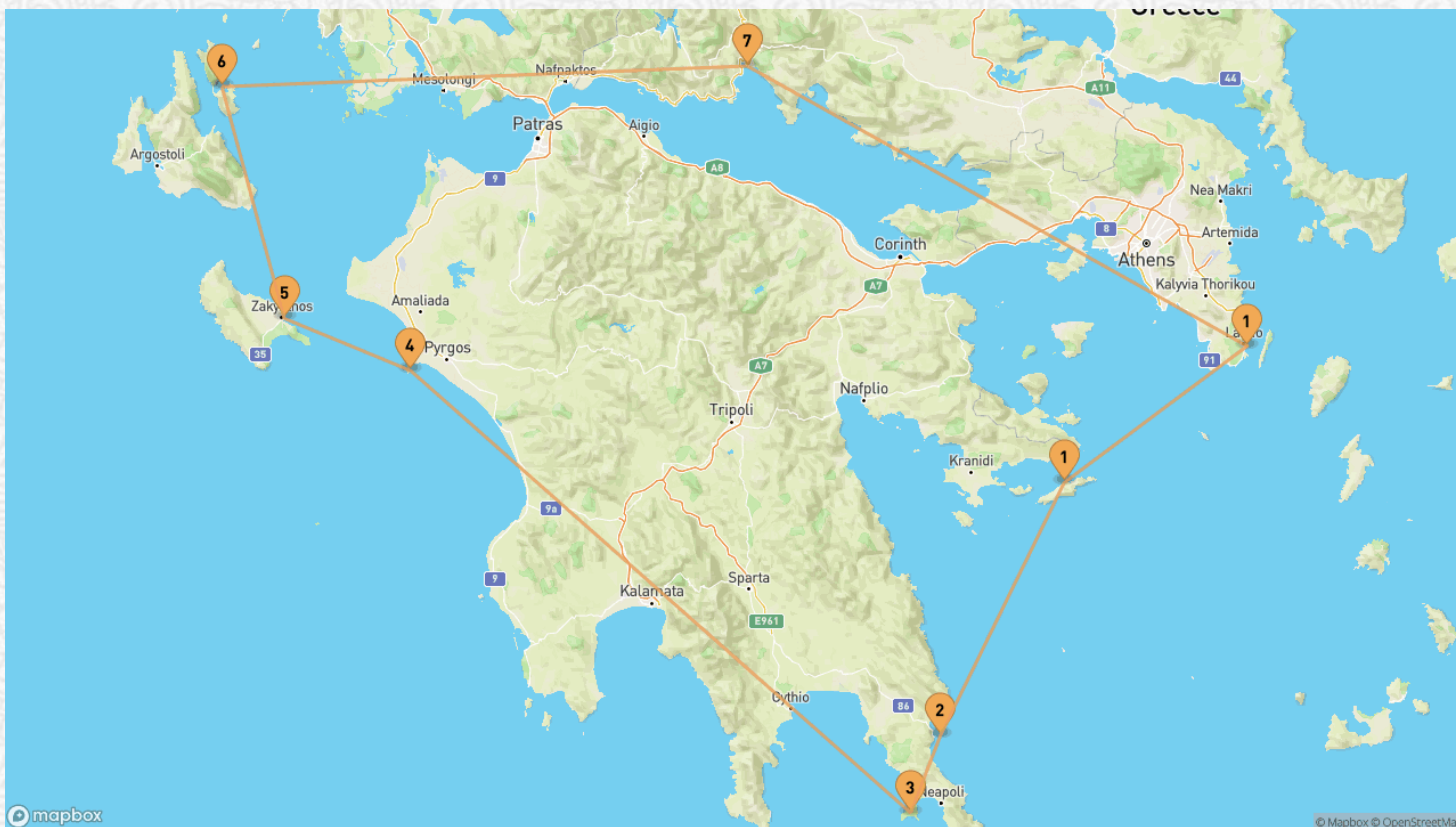

Greece / Lavrion

📍 Mainland port, Town

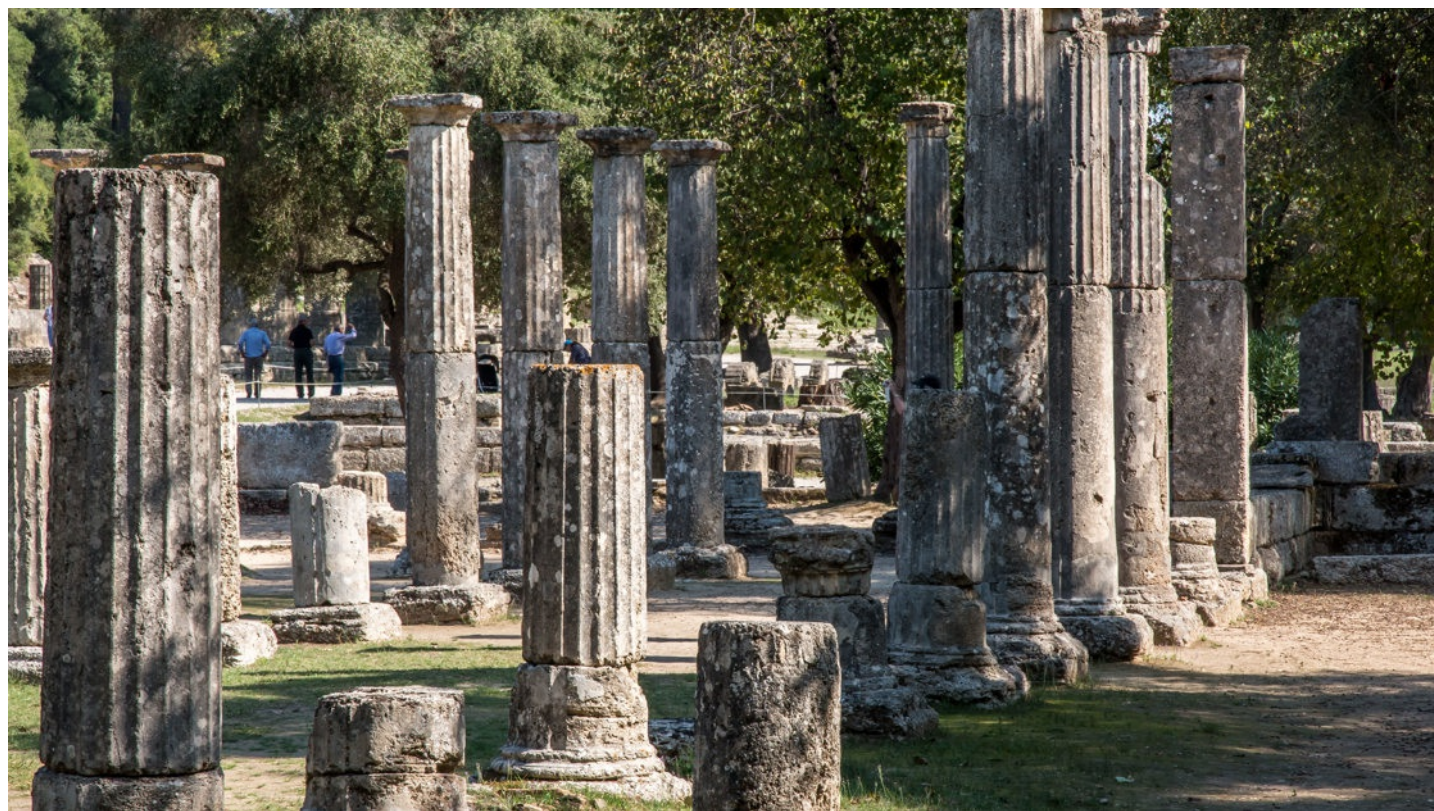


PAVLOPETRI

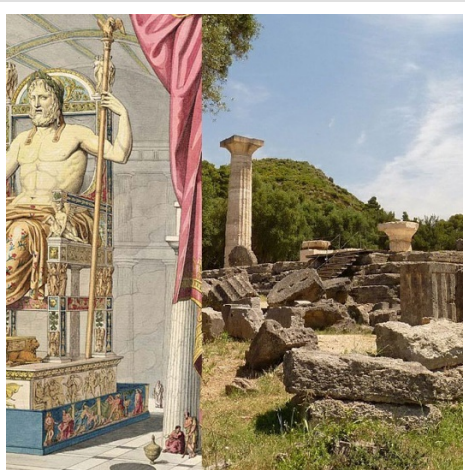
Day 4
