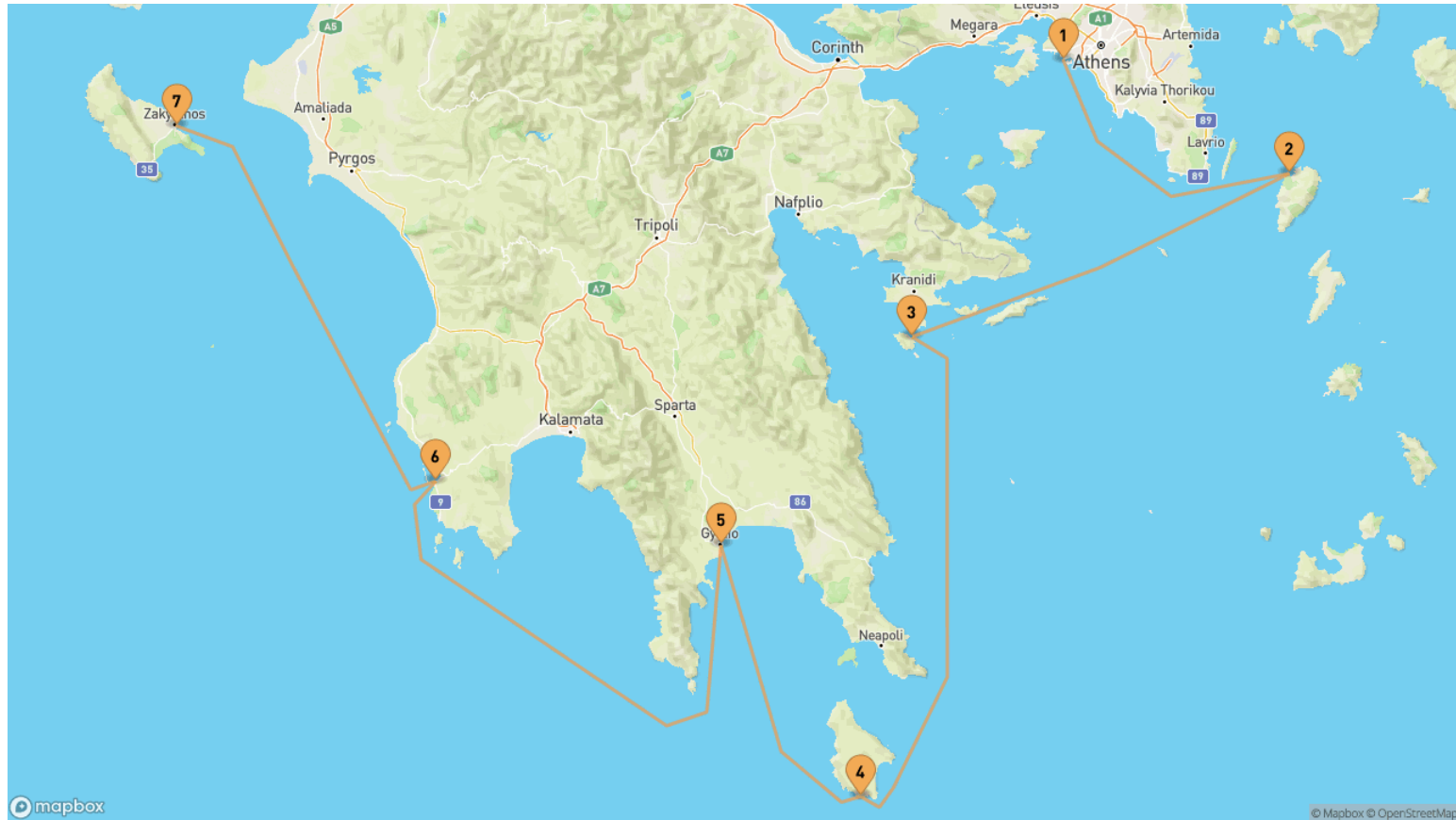

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Day 1



[Greece / Athens-Piraeus](#)

Mainland port

City where you can find a Roman tomb in the basement of the clothing store and a metro station where you can walk through the remnants of an ancient necropolis.

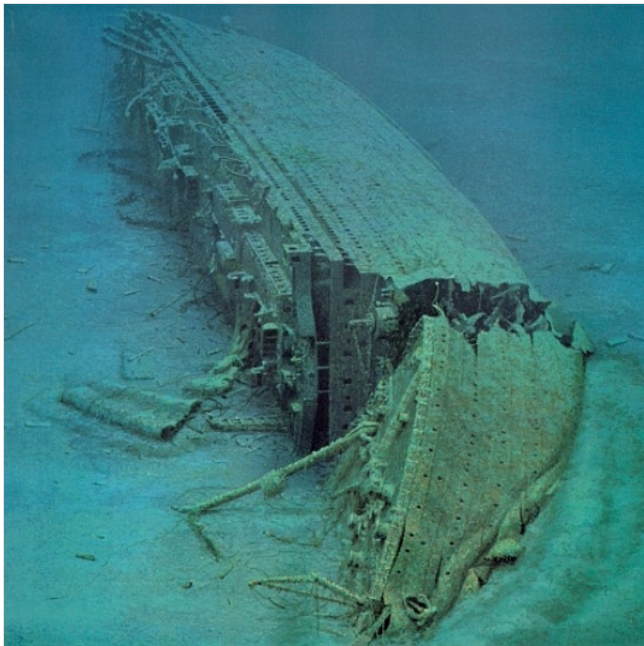
Day 2



[Greece / Kea](#)

Island, Greenery

Meet Kea: World known shipwrecks, Royal Oak Forest, ancient lion and Ancient Karthea, plentiful springs.



[HMHS Britannic](#)

Wreck, Diving

Dive only if you are a technical diver! There are four shipwrecks: HMHS Britannic at 120 m depth, French Ocean Liner S/S Burdigala at 70m depth, Junkers 52 at 65 m depth, and Otto Steamship

Day 3



[Greece / Spetses](#)

Island

Spetses is where superyachts pop up and out next to traditional wooden fishing boats and where the super-rich rub shoulders with the locals in quayside tavernas. All are drawn to this pine-covered island for its clear waters, coves and Spetses Town, untainted by package tourism.



[Shipyards](#)

The shipyards in Hydra have been in operation since the 18th century and are known for their skilled craftsmen and traditional shipbuilding techniques. Visitors can take a tour of the ship yards and watch as boats and ships are built and repaired by hand, using traditional tools and methods.

Day 4



[Greece / Kythera](#)

Island

Kythera is one of the most secluded Greek islands, hence not very touristy. It is crossed with rivers and gorges, covered with plane and pine trees. But Kythera also offers an ancient destroyed town of Paleohora, several shipwrecks and numerous cavernous churches.



[Mentor shipwreck](#)

Wreck, Diving, Historic

Witness an ancient shipwreck of the Mentor. The ship sank with Parthenon marbles. Divers are still researching.

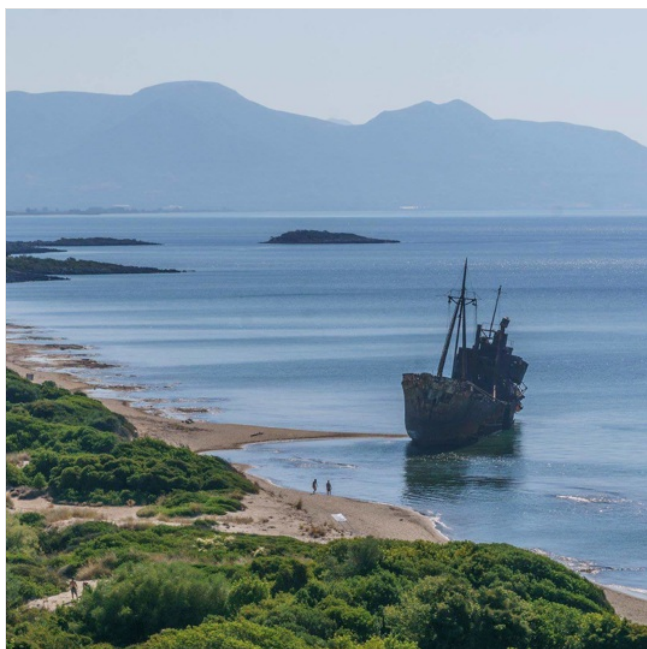
Day 5



[Greece / Gytheio](#)

Mainland port, Town

Nowadays Gytheio is a calm and secluded town that used to be a seaport for the legendary Sparta and Mystras



[Dimitrios](#)

Wreck

Swim beside the Shipwreck Dimitrios where the rusted, but still whole, ship rests on the pebbles

Day 6



[Greece / Pylos](#)

Mainland port

Mirriad of beaches across a vast bay, lagoon with flamingos, waterfalls, caves, castles, tombs, kayaking and diving, golf center and natural resorts - entwine activities into a hit pack in Pylos.

[Greece / Zakynthos](#)

Venetians called Zakynthos the Flower of the East due to natural wonders: the Shipwreck beach, the arcade of blue caves, National Marine Park sheltering rare Caretta-Caretta turtles, thickets of cypresses, pine trees and olives and sugar-fine sand beaches. All this framed with sounds of mandolin kantades.
