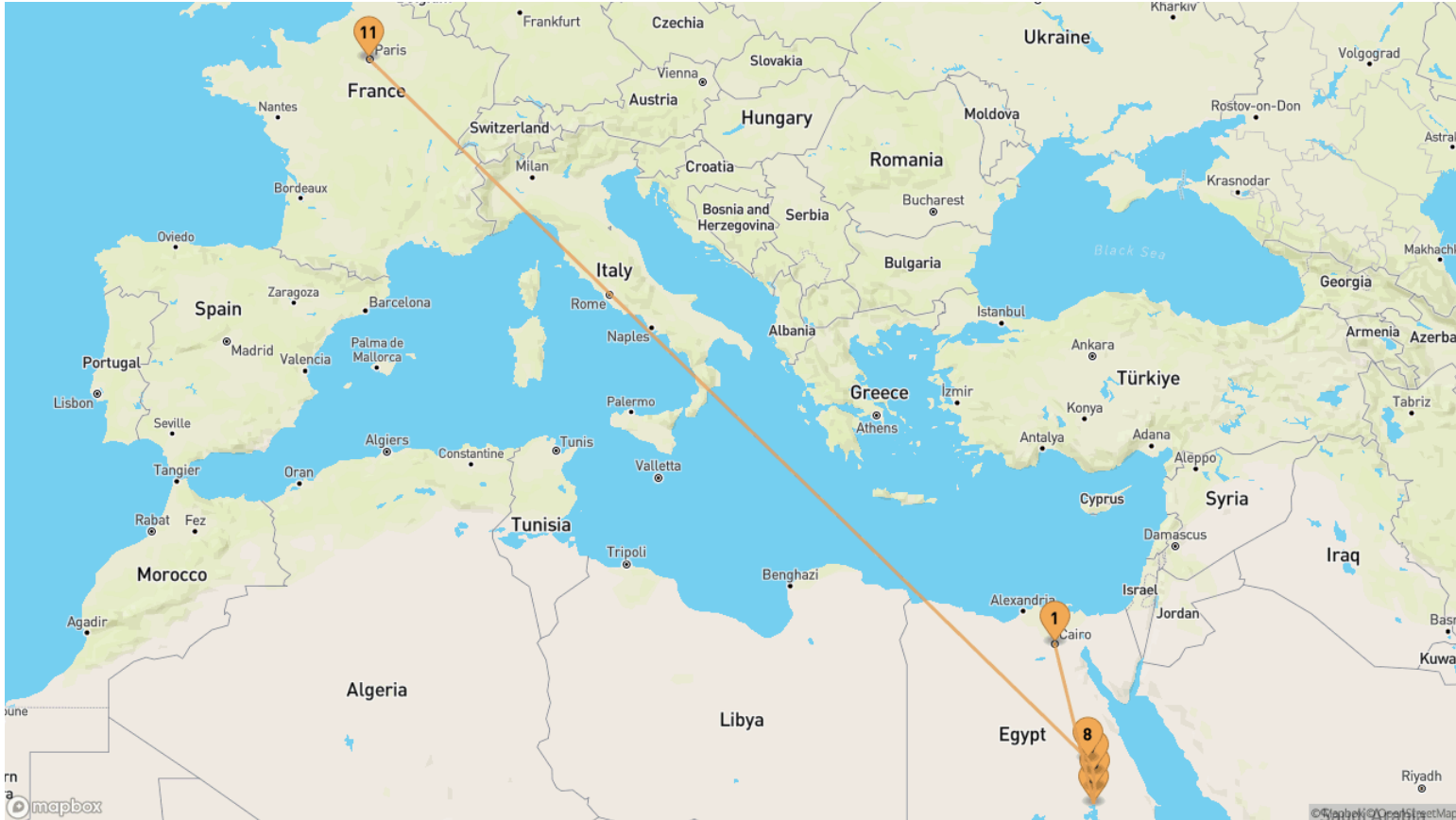




Cruise the mythical Nile in Dahabieh, Cairo, Aswan, Luxor

DAY 1: FRANCE - CAIRO

Departure on scheduled flight. Arrival at Cairo airport where you will be met and assisted with visa formalities. Transfer to your Royal Maxime Palace Kempinski 5* hotel (or similar) in Cairo. Installation, dinner and night at the hotel.

DAY 3: CAIRO

Departure after breakfast for a visit to the Grand Egyptian Museum*, one of the largest museums in the world with impressive dimensions, built near the Giza Plateau, and scheduled to open in 2023. The museum contains the world's largest collection of Egyptian antiquities and contains many archaeological treasures, including the entire collection of Tutankhamun's tomb, discovered a century ago. Lunch at the restaurant then discovery of the old city of Cairo, a sprawling and bustling city with undeniable charm: you will visit in particular the Saladin Citadel and the Mohamed Ali Mosque. After a stroll in the famous Khan-al Khalili souk, return to the hotel. Dinner and overnight in Cairo.

*In case of postponement of the inauguration of the Grand Egyptian Museum, the visit will take place at the Egyptian Museum in Cairo which currently houses the collection.

DAY 4: CAIRO - ASWAN

Early morning transfer to Cairo airport and flight to Aswan. Welcome at the airport and transfer to the port for boarding the Dahabieh Queen Isis. Welcome, refreshment and installation in the cabins. Lunch on board.

On the afternoon program: visit the majestic temple of Isis, formerly built on the island of Philae. Built by one of the last Egyptian pharaohs in the 4th century BC, it was completed by the Romans. In the 1970s, it was moved to a neighboring island after the Aswan Dam was filled. Visit the city of Aswan and its famous souk where you will find a profusion of spices, fabrics and local crafts. Dinner and overnight on board.

DAY 5: ASWAN - ABU SIMBEL - ASWAN

Early departure to Aswan airport, flight to Abu Simbel. Visit the temple of Ramses II and its four colossi, a Nubian masterpiece moved under the auspices of UNESCO during the construction of the Aswan Dam in the 1960s. Next door, the temple of Hathor dedicated to Queen Nefertari, wife of the pharaoh, also displays six massive statues of the couple on its façade. Return to Aswan, lunch on board your dahabieh. In the afternoon, felucca ride on the Nile for a bucolic discovery of the islands, gardens, banks and Nubian villages of this part of the river. At the end of the day, possibility of a tea/coffee break on the terrace overlooking the Nile of the legendary Old Cataract hotel to watch the sunset. Dinner and night on board.

DAY 6: KOM OMBO - DJEBEL SILSILA

Breakfast on board. Navigation through superb landscapes to Kom Ombo. Visit the Ptolemaic temple of Kom Ombo, a unique temple dedicated to the worship of two divinities: the falcon god Haroëris and the crocodile god Sobek. . In ancient Egypt, the crocodile was a sacred animal symbolizing fertility and whose presence in the Nile announced floods favorable to the harvests. Return on board, lunch and navigation on the narrowest part of the Nile, between majestic hills sandstone. This stopover will be an opportunity to admire the quarries of Djebel Silsila, whose sandstone blocks were used to build most of the Egyptian temples, as well as the temple of Horemheb, with its steles sculpted into the cliff face, once the center of major annual ceremonies linked to the flooding of the Nile. Dedicated to the Theban triad and the gods of the Nile, this temple opens on the facade onto a spectacular gallery of pillars. Dinner and overnight on board.

Day 7



Navigation

DAY 7: EDFOU

Breakfast on board while you sail to the small island of Ramadi; after a short walk, arrival at the house of a local family to see the daily life of the inhabitants of the banks of the Nile: the fields, the garden, the animals, preparation of dishes etc. Return on board and navigation to Edfu. Visit the Greco-Roman temple of Horus, remarkable for its harmonious plan with perfect proportions. For nearly 2000 years, this temple was buried under the sands of the desert which explains its exceptional conservation. The major interest of this temple lies in its inscriptions which have allowed Egyptologists to understand in detail the daily worship of Horus as well as the most sumptuous ceremonies of ancient Egypt. The boat will dock on a small secret island for a peaceful night under the stars. Breakfast, lunch and dinner on board.

DAY 8: ESNA - LUXOR

Breakfast on board. Sailing to Esna. Following the rhythm of the wind, the Dahabieh Queen Isis will glide slowly and silently on the Nile, an opportunity to observe nature and the life of the river. From the sun deck of your dahabieh, you will be able to observe the passage of your boat in the Esna lock, before continuing to Luxor. Lunch, dinner and overnight on board.

DAY 9: LUXOR

Breakfast on board, departure to Dendera to visit the famous temple of Hathor, goddess of love, music and motherhood. Founded more than 2000 years before our era, this temple is one of the best preserved in Egypt and was embellished by many pharaohs, mainly the Ptolemaic dynasty. With a massive stone roof, it impresses with the quality of its hieroglyphs. In particular, you can observe the famous zodiac of Dendera, the original being today preserved in the Louvre Museum.

Return to Luxor for lunch on board.

On the afternoon program: visit to the mythical temple of Karnak, the most imposing religious complex of ancient Egypt. Built over the millennia, it is dedicated to the god Amon. At the entrance to the temple, 40 ram-headed sphinxes lead you to the great hypostyle hall with its spectacular forest of columns, the largest of all Egyptian temples. Visit to the temple of Luxor and return to the dahabieh. Dinner and overnight on board.
