
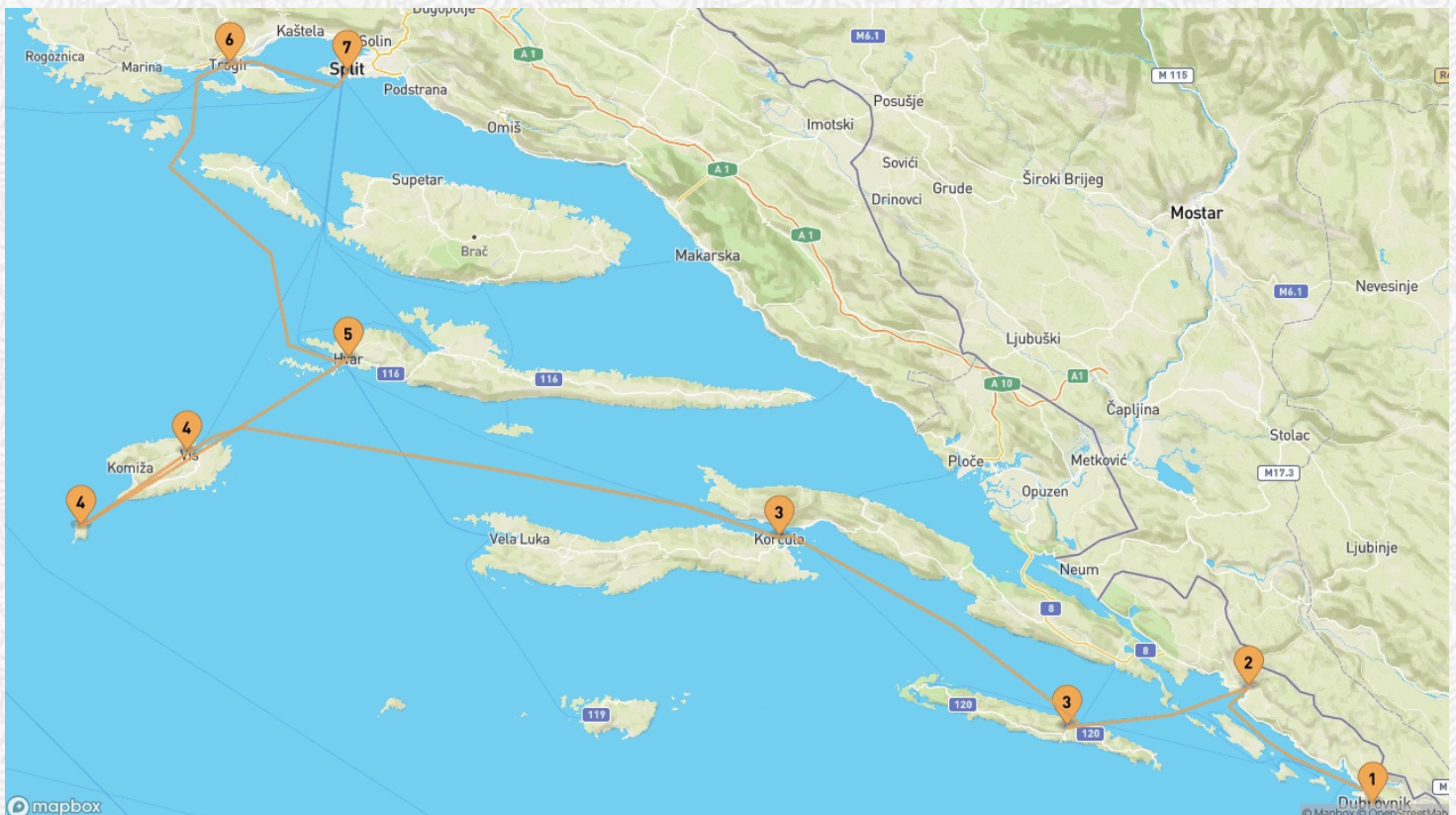


DUBROVNIK TO SPLIT DELUXE CRUISE 2024

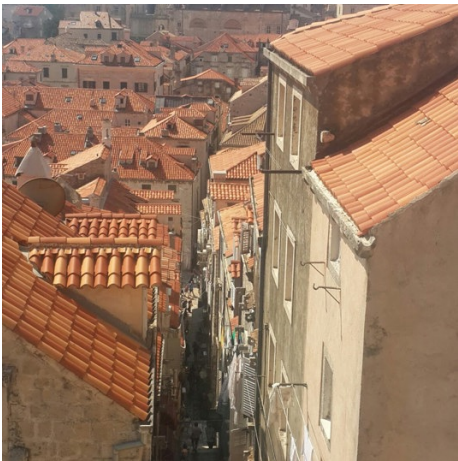
Day 1

Croatia / Mljet

Despite its tranquil magic and untouched nature Mljet is not among the list of the most popular travel destinations. The island has rich history and was a home to many different cultures. Mljet was known in the ancient Greek world under the name of Melita, which means honey. The western part of the island is a National Park and from the times the beauty of this alluring island had captivated Odysseus, its charm remains undisputable. Relish it's rustic peaceful atmosphere and feel the time slowing down in Mljet.

FISHERMAN'S MUSEUM

Being an important strategic military stronghold for a long time, Vis was spared the excessive tourist development and thus retained its unspoilt beaches, ecological agriculture and traditional architecture. Enjoy afternoon, exploring the town of Vis, its picturesque stone streets, pristine beaches and fine taverns. For all who are interested can opt for a military tour and Vis Island excursion, ending in Komiža, stunning fishermen's village to have dinner in one of cosy restaurants.



Croatia / Bishevo

Description: Bishevo is a small port town located in the Adriatic Sea, known for its stunning natural beauty. The town is surrounded by crystal clear waters, making it a great destination for swimming and diving. One of the most popular attractions in Bishevo is the Blue Cave, a stunning natural wonder that glows with a bright blue light. Visitors can take a boat tour to explore the cave and witness its ethereal beauty. In addition to the Blue Cave, Bishevo is also home to a number of beautiful beaches, including Stiniva Beach, which was voted the best beach in Europe in 2016.



BLUE CAVE

Visitors can take a small boat tour into the cave to see the shimmering blue light that reflects off the walls, creating a magical atmosphere.

Day 5



Croatia / Hvar

Day 6



Croatia / Trogir

📍 Island, Mainland port, Town

Trogir was founded by the Greek colonists as a major port in the 3rd century BC and was then known under the name of Tragurion. The town has flourished in the 13-15 centuries. Its gorgeous historic center with its elegant Baroque and Renaissance facades, palaces and Romanesque churches looks more like an outdoor museum than a real town and was rightfully acknowledged by UNESCO a World Heritage Site. Trogir is one of the most beautiful towns and islands in the whole world and a true jewel for a curious traveler.



TROGIR TOWN EXCURSION

This town – museum is literally packed with palaces, churches, monasteries and towers, the main attraction being the Cathedral of St. Lawrence, probably the finest example of sacral architecture in Croatia.

Day 7
