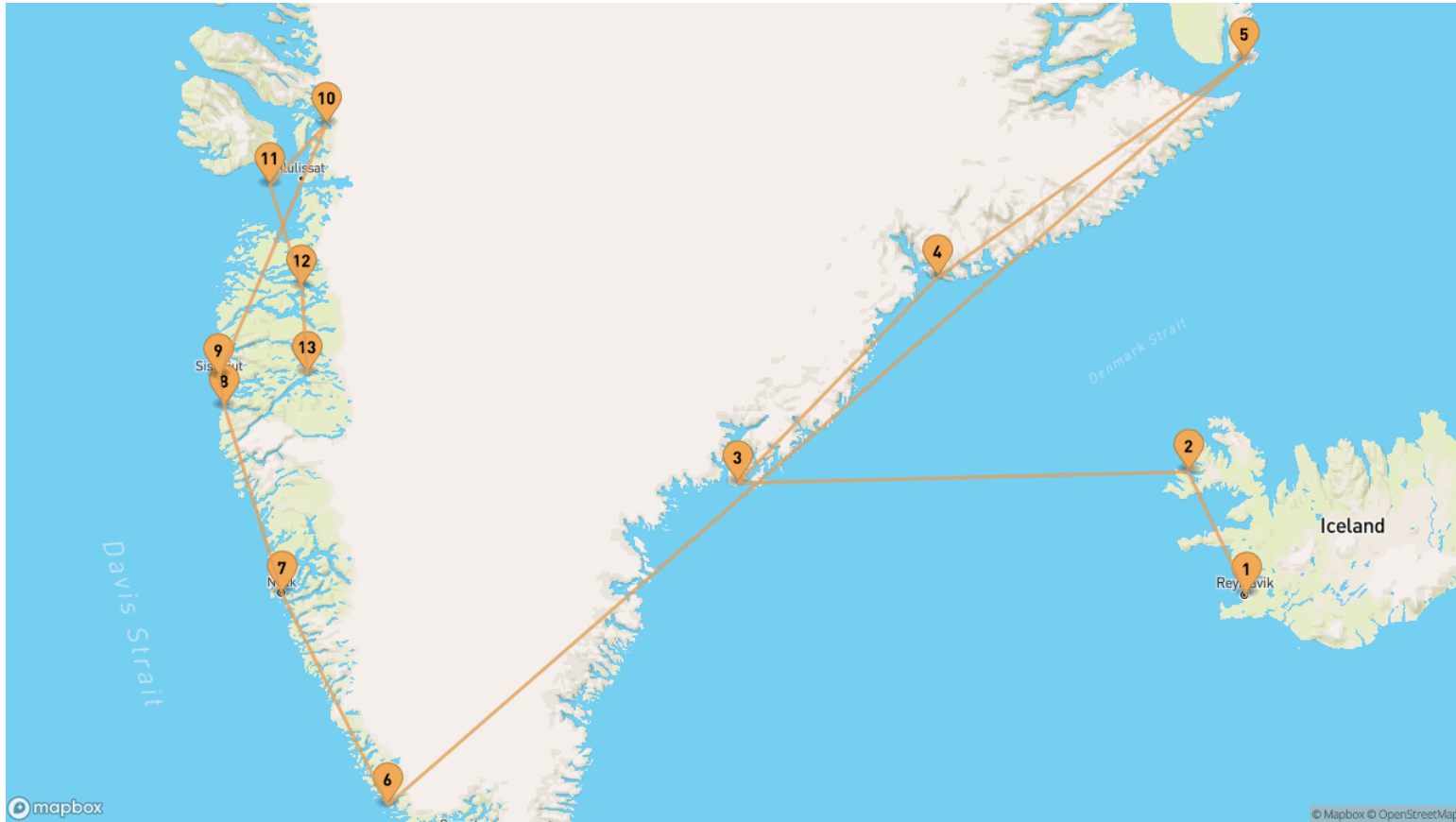


Greenland Inuit Villages Cruise from Geneva

Discover a unique destination where the past and present meet in perfect harmony.

DAY 1: GENEVA - REYKJAVIK (Iceland)

Departure from Paris on a scheduled flight to Reykjavik or on a scheduled flight to Paris then on a special flight to Reykjavik. Upon arrival in Reykjavik, transfer to the port, boarding and installation on board the World Explorer. Dinner on board.

Town

Welcome to the beautiful and remote port of Angmagssalik, also known as Tasiilaq, located in eastern Greenland. This port is known for its stunning natural beauty, with majestic icebergs and rugged mountain peaks framing the picturesque town.

DAY 3: TASIILAQ (Greenland)

Along an almost circular fjord lies Tasiilaq, one of the most beautiful towns in Greenland. Breakfast, lunch and dinner on board.

DAY 4: NAVIGATION IN THE PRINCE CHRISTIAN PASSAGE

Take advantage of this day of navigation to participate in the activities offered on board. At the end of the day, navigation in the Prince Christian Passage. Throughout its 100 km, you can admire its magnificent landscapes. This passage offers an unforgettable spectacle. Breakfast, lunch and dinner on board.

DAY 5: NANORTALIK

Located on an island, Nanortalik, which means "the place with polar bears", is one of the first places of habitation of the Inuit and the Scandinavian colonizers. Breakfast, lunch and dinner on board.

DAY 6: ARSUK FJORD

Located in the municipality of Sermersooq, the area was first settled by the Saqqaq people before the arrival of the Norse and then the Thule people. The discovery of cryolite in the inner parts of the Arsuk Fjord attracted the interest of the Danish during the colonial era who settled there in 1805. Breakfast, lunch and dinner on board.

DAY 7: NUUK

Located at the entrance to one of the largest fjords in the world, Nuuk was inhabited by the Vikings from the 10th century, then became the refuge of the Inuit populations in the 12th century. It is a regional capital where traditions and modernity coexist harmoniously between picturesque and official buildings. Free time or participation in optional excursions. Breakfast, lunch and dinner on board.

Optional excursions

NUUK AND ITS NATIONAL MUSEUM

Discovery of the old city where there are old colonial-style buildings. After a panoramic tour to admire the urban planning of this young, booming capital, visit the national museum which traces the history of the mysterious civilizations that have succeeded one another on this land of ice. It houses very beautiful collections of objects related to the daily life of the Inuit and also brings together famous mummies discovered.

NUUK AND ITS INHABITANTS

Departure on foot to be received at the home of the locals for a kaffemik, a Greenlandic tradition which consists of opening one's house to celebrate any kind of event, from a birthday to the first day of school. Welcome around a coffee and local specialties for a moment of sharing with the host in order to discuss the daily life of the Greenlanders.

Day 8

DAY 8: KANGAAMIUT - ITILLEQ

In the morning, discovery of the island and the village of Kangaamiut located between the mouths of two long fjords. In the afternoon, stopover in the village of Itilleq with its wooden houses, painted blue. Breakfast, lunch and dinner on board.

Day 9

DAY 9: SISIMIUT

Nestled at the foot of a large rock, Sisimiut is the oldest city in Greenland. With its 5,500 inhabitants, it is now the second largest city in the country. Free time or participation in optional excursions. Breakfast, lunch and dinner on board.

Optional excursions

DISCOVERING SISIMIUT ON FOOT

Walking tour of about 2 hours to discover Sisimiut, located in a mountainous landscape. Crossing the old town with its beautiful colonial houses, the heart of the city, Lake Nalunnguarfik where all the winter activities start and the meat market. Free visit of the Sisimiut museum housing a collection of crafts, tools and old objects as well as a church altarpiece dating from the 17th century and some paintings from the end of the 18th century.

MOUNTAIN HIKING

Hiking to discover the surrounding mountains. Departure by bus to the city border and the start of the Arctic Circle Trail. From there, walk through the mountainous landscapes in nature and along streams to discover the delicate flora of the Arctic mountains full of scents and colors.

Day 10

DAY 10: EQIP SERMIA GLACIER

The Eqip Sermia glacier is one of the most active in Greenland. The spectacle of calving is striking when blocks of ice break off and fall into the water with a crashing sound. Breakfast, lunch and dinner on board.

Day 11

DAY 11: ILULISSAT – DISKO BAY

At the edge of a glacial tongue that generates the largest quantity of icebergs in the northern hemisphere, lies Ilulissat and its icefjord, a wonder classified as a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Sailing in a world of ice where The silence is broken only by the crashing of icebergs. Free time or participation in optional excursions. Breakfast, lunch and dinner on board.

Optional excursions

THE ILULISSAT ICE FJORD BY SEA

On board local boats accompanied only by the captain, navigation of approximately 1h45 along the coast of Ilulissat towards the mouth of the fjord to meet the floating icebergs in Disko Bay and its ice cliffs. A grandiose spectacle and striking in the face of these colossal masses with blue reflections, deep caverns, and sides attacked by winds and foam.

SERMERMUT AND THE ILULISSAT FROZEN FJORD

Crossing Ilulissat by coach to reach "the end of the road". Then walk (about 45 min.) to the Sermermut lookout which offers a magnificent view of the mouth of the fjord dotted with icebergs. Sermermut is also a important archaeological center where many civilizations have succeeded one another: Saqqaq, Dorset, Thule... The return to the coach will also be on foot in the heart of this magical landscape (approximately 45 min.).

DAY 13: KANGERLUSSUAQ - GENEVA

Breakfast on board. Disembarkation and transfer to the airport. Flight to Paris on a special flight then to Geneva on a regular flight.
