


Portugal / Port

Mainland port, Popular

Porto is a coastal city in northwest Portugal known for its stately bridges and port wine production. Its historic center is a UNESCO World Heritage Site of narrow cobblestone streets brimming with romantic buildings spanning the centuries and a Romanesque cathedral. In the medieval Ribeira (riverside) district, narrow cobbled streets wind past merchants' houses and cafes.

DAY 5: PORTO

At the mouth of the Douro, Porto dominates the river and bears witness to a rich history spanning two millennia. Its historic centre is a UNESCO World Heritage Site. With its bridges, baroque churches, azulejos, flower-filled balconies and shopping streets, the city has managed to retain all its authenticity. Its lively quays offer magnificent views of the Maria Pia Bridge designed by

Eiffel Tower and the century-old warehouses of the merchants of the famous Port and Douro wines. Free time or participation in optional excursions. Breakfast, lunch and dinner on board.

DAY 6: LA CORUNA (Spain)

This port in the northwest of Spain is also the most important city in Galicia, a region at the end of the world with wild and jagged coasts. A port city, La Coruña is famous for its Roman lighthouse and its medieval old town. The Art Deco houses of the city center make it a charming stopover but also the gateway to Santiago de Compostela where the tomb of Saint James and its Romanesque cathedral have attracted pilgrims and visitors since 829. Free time or participation in optional excursions. Breakfast, lunch and dinner on board.
