




Southern Italy Route: the most beautiful coast in Italy, views of Vesuvius and volcanic islands.

## Day 1



### [Italy / Napoli](#)

Mainland port, Popular, City

The Lungomare is a beach promenade that follows the shore for about 2.4 kilometers along Via Partenope and Via Francesco Caracciolo in the Chiaia neighborhood, with beautiful views across the bay to Vesuvius and plenty of cafés and ice-cream shops.

## Day 2



### [Italy / Ponza](#)

Greenery, Island

A fairytale destination dotted with brightly painted traditional houses. An island formed from the remains of an extinct volcano.

## Day 3



### [Italy / Ischia](#)

Island, Secluded

Ischia's hot springs are one of the highlights of the island, with curative properties, beautiful grounds, and stretches of beach. Ischia Ponte, the oldest village on Ischia, features classic Mediterranean architecture, and then stop for a visit at the imposing Castello Aragonese.

## Day 4



### [Italy / Capri](#)

Island, Secluded

Inside the Gardens of Augustus, drink in the panorama overlooking Marina Piccola and the Faraglioni rock formations. Stop in at the Charterhouse of San Giacomo or walk uphill to the Roman ruins of Villa Jovis, where the ancient emperor Tiberio would take a break from Rome.

## Day 5



### [Italy / Palinuro](#)

Secluded, Mainland port, Village

Palinuro is a small seaside resort in the southern Italian region of Campania. Several caves can be visited, each of which has its own special attraction - a 'blue' cave, a 'blood' grotto and so on.

## Day 6



### [Italy / Agropoli](#)

Town, Mainland port

The town sports two major landmarks: Trentova-Tresino natural reserve and Il Castello, built by the Byzantines in the 5th century.

### [Italy / Salerno](#)

Mainland port, Town

Salerno cathedral dates back to the 11th Century. Old Town medieval buildings were built on roman ruins. Castello di Arechi was built in the seventh century.

## Day 8



### [Italy / Amalfi](#)

Popular, Romantic, Village

Arguably the most beautiful 48 kilometers of coastline in Italy. Carved into cliffs that are already cut by deep ravines, the road clings high above the Tyrrhenian Sea in a series of breathtaking views and curves bounded by almost vertical mountains rising on one side and long vertical drops on the other.



### [Italy / Positano](#)

Mainland port, Romantic, Popular, Village

The Amalfi Coast's most famous and legendary hillside village, the picturesque and romantic Positano. The sight of the beige, pink, yellow and terra-cotta houses cascading down the side of the coast to crystal blue Mediterranean waters is famous across the world and has been mesmerizing visitors to this captivating section of the Italian coast for centuries.



## Italy / Sorrento

Town, Mainland port

Piazza Tasso was built above one of the many "vallon", or small gorges, which have been carved out over time by streams rushing from the hills behind Sorrento down to the Mediterranean sea. At the very bottom of the gorge, you can still see the ruins of one of the many water-powered mills that once lined these gorges, with a lumberyard adjacent.
