France / Dunkirk

Mainland port, Town

DAY 1: GENEVA - DUNKERQUE or ZEEBRUGES (Belgium)

Departure on the scheduled flight to Paris or Brussels. Coach transfer to the port of Dunkirk (May 15, 2025) or Zeebrugge (May 22 and May 29, 2025). Embarkation and installation on board the World Explorer. Dinner on board.



Navigation DAY 2: NAVIGATION

Take advantage of this day of navigation to participate in the activities offered on board. Breakfast, lunch and dinner on board.

DAY 3: BERGEN (Norway)

Surrounded by mountains and fjords, Bergen is a true gem located on the southwest coast of Norway. With its magnificent multi-colored wooden houses, huddled together, its beautiful residences clinging to the hillside, its small cobbled streets, the city is one of the most beautiful in the kingdom. Its traditional architecture in painted wood contrasts with the blue of the sea and the green of the mountains and bathes in a joyful and warm atmosphere. Its picturesque quays, lined with old warehouses listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site, are the most obvious vestige of the time when Bergen, capital of the Hanseatic League, was a major center of trade with the rest of Europe. Today, these quays house a museum, shops, galleries and restaurants, and remain a friendly and popular place. Not far from there, the lively fish market has been supplying the inhabitants since 1276! Free time or participation in optional excursions. Breakfast, lunch and dinner on board.

OPTIONAL EXCURSION

DISCOVERY OF BERGEN

Discovery of Bergen on foot for about 2h30 passing by the central square, the music pavilion, the hall of King Hakon, the Rosenkrantz tower, the Saint-Marie church... Walk in the district of Bryggen classified as a UNESCO world heritage site and whose old wooden buildings once belonged to the German merchants of the Hanseatic League. Visit of the Schøtstuene museum dedicated to the history of the Hanse which was at the heart of the trade of the countries of the Baltic Sea from the 12th to the 13th century. OR

BERGEN AND MOUNT FLOYEN

Walk through the Hanseatic district of Bryggen known for its unique architecture. Emblematic of medieval history and culture, its houses today house many shops, restaurants, artists' and craftsmen's workshops. The visit continues with the discovery of Mount Floyen (320 m above sea level), accessible by funicular, from where the view is superb.

Norway / Gudvangen

DAY 4: FLAM - GUDVANGEN

A small village located at the end of a very narrow fjord, Flam is set in an impressive landscape of very high cliffs dotted with waterfalls. A popular tourist destination since the end of the 19th century, Flam is known for its old century-old farms and especially for its train which runs through a grandiose setting on one of the steepest lines in the world. In the afternoon, head for Gudvangen, a typical village of Viking origin located at the bottom of a fjord and a steep valley. Free time or take part in optional excursions departing from Flam. Breakfast, lunch and dinner on board.

OPTIONAL EXCURSIONS:

THE LITTLE FLAM TRAIN (day with lunch)

Departure by train from Flam for a ride through the high mountains. Arrival in Myrdal and departure by train towards Voss after a stop at the Kjosfossen waterfall. Between steep valleys, snow-capped mountains and rivers, the journey takes in nearly 20 tunnels. After lunch, continue by coach to Gudvangen, crossing the splendid mountain plateaus.

OR

THE VILLAGE OF AURLAND AND THE SOGNEFJORD

Departure by coach from Flam for a tour of approximately 2h30 along the majestic Sognefjord to Aurland, a traditional village established around a 13th century church. Stop at the Stegastein viewpoint. Located at an altitude of 650 m, this observation platform with its unique architecture offers an unforgettable experience and a breathtaking view of one of the most beautiful fjords in the world. Free time to discover the village before returning to Flam.

OR

THE VOSS CABLE CAR

Depart by coach from Flam towards Voss where you will take the brand new cable car to reach the summit of the mountain at an altitude of 820 m.

After enjoying the superb panorama, descend by cable car and travel by coach to Gudvangen via Stalheim and the Naeroy Valley. Stop en route at the Tvindefossen Falls, a 152 m high waterfall.

Norway / Geiranger

DAY 5: GEIRANGER

The village of Geiranger is nestled at the end of the fjord of the same name. The wildest, narrowest and most magnificent of Norway's fjords, 16 km long, is on the UNESCO World Heritage List.

Free time or participation in optional excursions. Breakfast, lunch and dinner on board.

OPTIONAL EXCURSIONS:

THE ROUTE OF THE EAGLES AND THE HERDAL VALLEY

On the road to a magnificent nature where the stunning landscape of steep mountains is embellished with waterfalls, deep fjords and fertile valleys. The Eagle Road, with its 11 hairpin bends, is breathtaking and dizzying. Stop at the Eagle bend to enjoy the magnificent panorama of the Geirangerfjord, a World Heritage Site. Continue through UNESCO. Continue through exceptional landscapes of snow-capped mountains and green valleys to the charming village of Eidsdal, located on the

Storfjord. Finally, departure on foot to one of the famous summer farms and tasting of farm products.

OR

CLIMBING MOUNT DALSNIBBA

Departure by the Nibbevegen road to reach the summit of Mount Dalsnibba which is located at an altitude of 1,495m. During the journey, discover the magnificent viewpoints on the dark waters of the fjord dominated by the cliffs. On reaching the Djupvatnet lake located at an altitude of 1,000m, the scenery changes to a world of rough rocks, ice and snow. On the way back, stop at the Djupvashytta chalet, located on the edge of the Djupvatnet lake, to enjoy a delicious pastry.

Norway / Stavanger

Popular, Mountain, Mainland port, Discovery, Town

DAY 6: STAVANGER

In the morning, cruise through the waters of southern Norway before arriving in the beautiful bay of Stavanger. Norway's fourth city has also been the heart of the oil industry since 1969, when the first oil field was discovered southwest of its coast. The capital of oil, the country's greatest wealth, is home to the Norwegian Petroleum Museum. However, there is no ostentation in this welcoming university town. Its historic center is home to numerous museums, St. Svithun Cathedral, built between 1100 and 1125 in pure Anglo-Norman style, and a district of wooden houses, the best preserved in Europe, made up of more than 170 white wooden houses. Free time or participation in optional excursions. Breakfast, lunch and dinner on board.

OPTIONAL EXCURSIONS:

STAVANGER PANORAMIC TOUR

Discover the "Iron Age" cathedral, one of the few churches in Norway to have kept its original appearance. Continue with a visit to the "Iron Age" farm, which is a reconstruction of an agricultural settlement from 550 to 350 BCE. Continue through the residential areas and arrive at the Ullandhaug viewpoint. The tour ends with a walk through the old town of Stavanger, made up of more than 170 houses dating from the 18th and 19th centuries.

OR

MINI-CRUISE IN THE LYSEFJORD

Embark on a mini-cruise (approx. 2h30) in the archipelago to observe the Norwegian way of life through this region dotted with small idyllic islands. Navigation in the splendid Lysefjord, overlooked by the famous Pulpit Rock. Passage under this mythical promontory which rises to a height of 200 m and represents one of the most spectacular wonders of Norway. A snack will be served on board or during a stop along the fjord.
